**Rationale 2:** CDSR contains citations and abstracts for over 5500 systematic reviews that relate to a wide variety of health care interventions, but it does not contain information from the National League for Nursing. (See page 24)

**Rationale 3:** DARE lists over 3000 citations of systematic reviews; however, it does not contain information from the National League for Nursing. (See page 24)

**Rationale 4:** CINAHL lists all applicable English-language nursing journals plus publications from the National League for Nursing. (See page 24)

**Rationale 3:** The Boolean operator “not” will provide citations that include the words “adolescents using marijuana” but not with those containing the word “cocaine.” This may or may not provide the maximum results. (See page 29)

**Rationale 4:** The Boolean operator “not” will provide citations that include the words “school-age children” but not with those containing the word “bullying.” This may or may not provide the maximum results. (See page 29)

**Rationale 2:** Self-urinary catheterization in chronic disease would be a citation that needs more investigation because self-urinary catheterization is in the title and multiple sclerosis is a chronic disease. (See page 32)

**Rationale 3:** Urine output approaches for people with multiple sclerosis would be a citation that needs more investigation because multiple sclerosis is in the title and self-urinary catheterization is a urine output approach. (See page 32)



**Rationale 4:** Infection rates with self-urinary catheterization would be eliminated. Even though the title includes self-urinary catheterization, the article is focusing on infection rates and does not include anything about multiple sclerosis. (See page 32)

**Rationale 4:** The *Public Health Nursing* journal will focus on the health needs and the impact of the environment and industry on the health of the general population. Diabetes may or may not be a focus in this journal. (See page 37)
