Introduction

The quizzes have been designed and class-tested to support a wide variety of teaching methods by furnishing you with prepared, editable supplementary material that is a stimulating and effective teaching tool for all different types of students. Used in conjunction with *The Prose Reader*, these quizzes can substantially help your students improve their understanding of the selections and of corresponding issues covered in class.

One vocabulary and one content quiz are provided for each selection in *The Prose Reader*, with answers to each of the quizzes supplied at the end of this section. Each vocabulary quiz focuses on six challenging words that have been selected specifically to expand your students' comprehension of the essays they read and to improve their ability to understand and use words effectively. The quizzes are especially useful in testing careful reading and in prompting discussions that demonstrate vocabulary in context. Next to each vocabulary word, a paragraph reference is provided so students can look up the words in context as they answer each question. Each content quiz includes six questions sequenced to mirror the order of the questions in *The Prose Reader*. The primary goal of these questions is to encourage your students to reach valid conclusions and make accurate judgments as they read and respond to the essays.

Regular use of these vocabulary and content quizzes will also promote careful reading, thereby improving your students' reading skills and insuring more productive in-class discussions on each essay topic. Quizzes can be graded quickly and easily, either by you or by peer groups in class, and they can be used to diagnose individual student problems with vocabulary development, comprehension, or analytical thinking. The vocabulary and content quizzes, which can be administered separately or as a set, also include the corresponding page numbers of the essay from *The Prose Reader*.
