Which of the following Tanner stages does this description meet?

Tanner stage 111

John, age 5, was diagnosed with ruptured tympanic membrane as a result of acute otitis media 2 weeks ago. He was treated with oral antibiotics at the time of diagnosis and has finished his course. He has no purulent drainage, his plan of care should include:
