Clients with allergies should be identified according to hospital policy at the time of admission. Completing a health history and performing a physical assessment are appropriate nursing actions at the time of a client's admission. A nurse should explain the plan of care to the client and his family. Clients in contact isolation are not permitted to enter areas that risk exposing other hospitalized clients without using special precautions. Hospital rules and policy should be reviewed at the time of admission.
